Where We Came From

In 1893, seven companies met at the Medinah Temple in Chicago to create the Illinois Manufacturers' Association—the first state manufacturing trade association in the United States—with a goal of influencing various laws and regulations at the State Capitol. We're very proud that those seven companies are all still members of the IMA more than 130 years later because they understood then, and still recognize, that Illinois manufacturers are a critical cog in our economy that need to speak with a single voice.

Our state's proud manufacturing heritage was borne of ideals, dreams and American ingenuity. Whether it was the Civil War, the Industrial Revolution, or the advent of the assembly line, Illinois manufacturing played a key role in most major historical events of our nation's history.

Among the notable Illinois inventions are the steel plow that allowed farmers to break the rich Illinois soil...while the Ferris Wheel and Cracker Jack debuted at the 1893 World's Fair. The refrigerated rail car was designed and manufactured in Illinois so that strawberries could be shipped by rail. Demand for George Pullman's sleeping car skyrocketed when it was attached to the funeral train carrying President Abraham Lincoln's body home.

Where We Are

Today, Illinois manufacturing companies produce combines and farm equipment, bulldozers and mining equipment, steel, White House china, food and beverages, components for the Mars Rover, and even macaroni & cheese. Illinois manufacturers contribute the single largest share of the state's economy and continue to be the economic engine for Illinois.

The Illinois Manufacturers' Association is the only association in Illinois dedicated exclusively to manufacturing. We are the oldest and one of the largest manufacturing associations in the nation, representing nearly 4,000 companies and facilities that employ nearly 650,000 workers from Cairo to Rockford, Danville to Moline. Our member companies reflect all sizes and sectors, from the Fortune 50 to small, family-owned businesses that serve as the backbone of every community in Illinois.

In recent years, we are proud to have been honored by our peers in other states as the inaugural recipient of the COSMA Leadership Award as the "best state manufacturing association" in the United States, and also to be honored for our pandemic-related work by the American Society of Association Executives as one of 100 "Associations That Will Save The World."

Our successes are **BOLDLY MOVING MAKERS FORWARD** in Illinois.

In recent years, the IMA's strong advocacy have saved Illinois employers billions in taxes, unemployment insurance, and workers compensation costs alone.

Other recent wins by the IMA include:

- •Five-year extension of the Research & Development tax credit.
- •Creation of a new Manufacturers Purchase Credit to exempt consumables (oils, fuel, coolants, etc.) from state and local sales taxes.
- •Enacted a new apprenticeship tax credit and dual credit programs to help manufacturers fund the next wave of workers.
- •Passed a new law so that all high schools will have to offer Career & Technical Education in school and enacted a new apprenticeship tax credit.
- •Worked in a coalition to successfully pass a new Illinois tax incentives for data centers, electric vehicle manufacturers and their suppliers, and semiconductor manufacturers and their suppliers.
- ·Initiated creation of two brand new Manufacturing Academies offering best-in-class training which will include one at Heartland (EV focus) and Southwest Illinois College (advanced manufacturing).

Manufacturers are addressing challenges and envisioning the future. As the most influential and respected voice of manufacturing in Illinois, the IMA is your champion.


